Bearberry, kinnikinnick	<i>Arctostaphylos uva-ursi</i>
Brewer saltbush	<i>Atriplex lentiformis breweri</i>
Sea lavender, statice	<i>Limonium latifolium</i>
Showy penstemon	<i>Penstemon spectabilis</i>
Western raspberry	<i>Rubus leucodermis</i>
