APPLICANT: Christine Saunders, Sagecrest Planning
COMMUNITY: Bloomington/5th Supervisorial District
PROJECT NO: P201900293
LOCATION: 10380 Alder Avenue
STAFF: Steven Valdez, Senior Planner
PROPOSAL: Conditional Use Permit for the construction of a 174,800 square-foot logistics warehouse building with 10,000 square feet of office space, with a variance to allow a 14'3" front yard setback (instead of the required 25' feet) on five parcels.

APPLICANT: Omya, Inc.
COMMUNITY: Lucerne Valley/3rd Supervisorial District
PROJECT NO: AP20120022
LOCATION: Approximately 7.5 miles south of Lucerne Valley and 5 miles north of Big Bear Lake within the San Bernardino National Forest (SBNF)

STAFF: Reuben J. Arceo, Contract Planner
PROPOSAL: A) An addition and revision to an existing Mining and Land Reclamation Plan Conditional Use Permit to expand the Butterfield and Sentinel Limestone Quarries on 94.9 acres of SBNF land.
B) Incorporate an amended Plan of Operations and Reclamation Plan.
The Butterfield and Sentinel Quarries would be mined for an additional 40 and 20 years, respectively. Up to 1,487,500 tons of material (limestone and waste rock) would be excavated resulting in 680,000 of quality limestone being produced annually.
