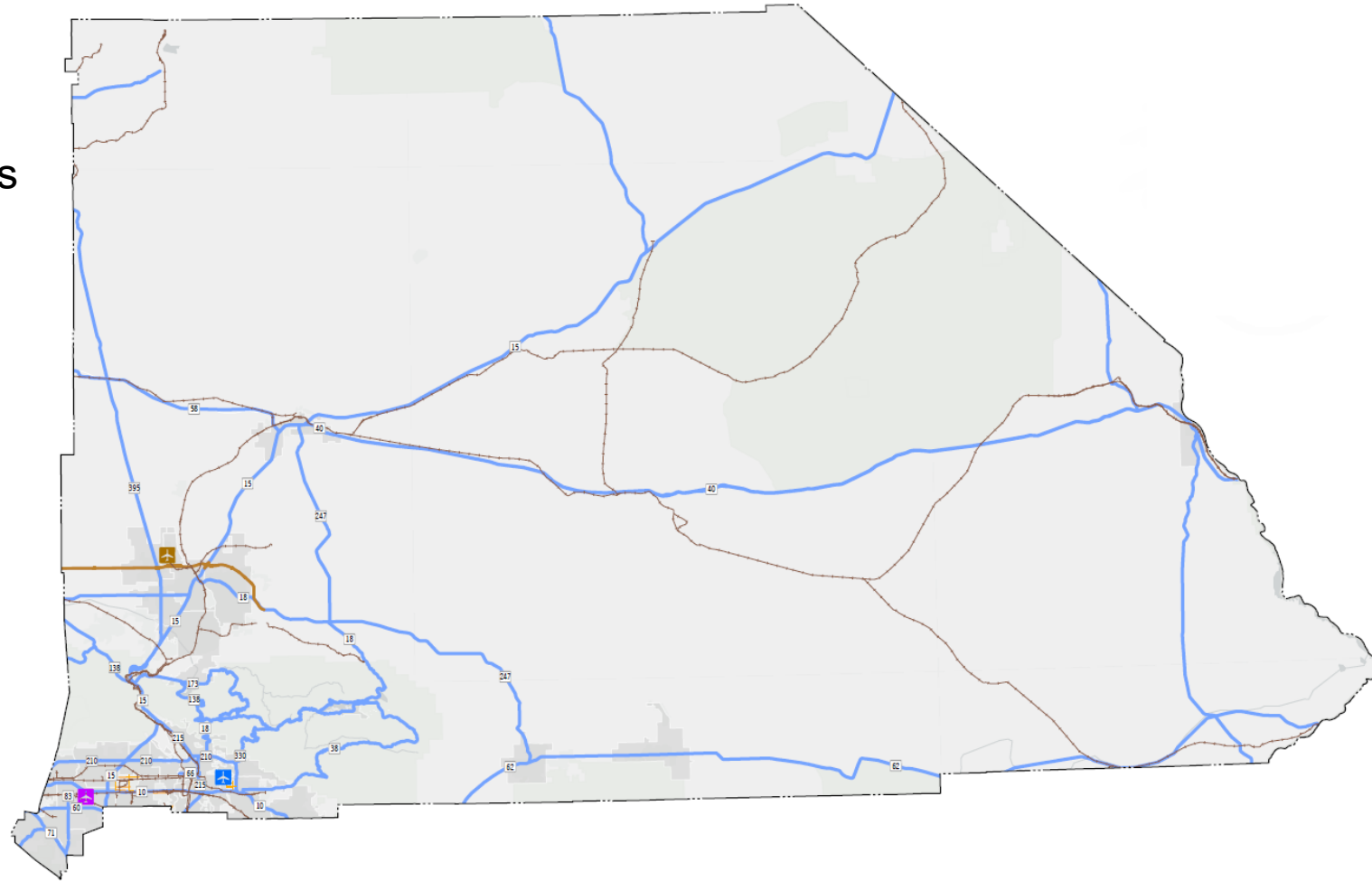

State law (Assembly Bill 98)

- Signed on September 29, 2024
- Created warehouse standards for projects submitted after September 29, 2024
- Jurisdictions required to designate truck routes by January 1, 2026

Status

- Adopted routes on December 16, 2025
- Adopted truck route map is available on the countywide plan webpage



Objectives	Status
Finalize signage program and complete installation	109 new truck route signs installed
Adopt weight-restricted roads identified in Phase I	Weight-restricted roads adopted September 1, 2026
Continue public outreach and feedback	Social Pinpoint Map launched March 3 rd
Continue collaboration with state, regional & local agencies to implement truck routes	Presentations online and in Bloomington, Devore, & Muscoy
Refine truck routes based on updated analysis & community input, as necessary	Ongoing coordination with partner agencies. No updates to truck routes at this time

California Highway Patrol (CHP)

- Designated truck routes
- Weight-restricted roads
- Illegal parking or idling on public roadways

Federal law allows trucks to travel along local roads when necessary to serve businesses or obtain food/rest/repairs by the safest and practical route regardless of truck route designations (23 CFR 658.19(a))

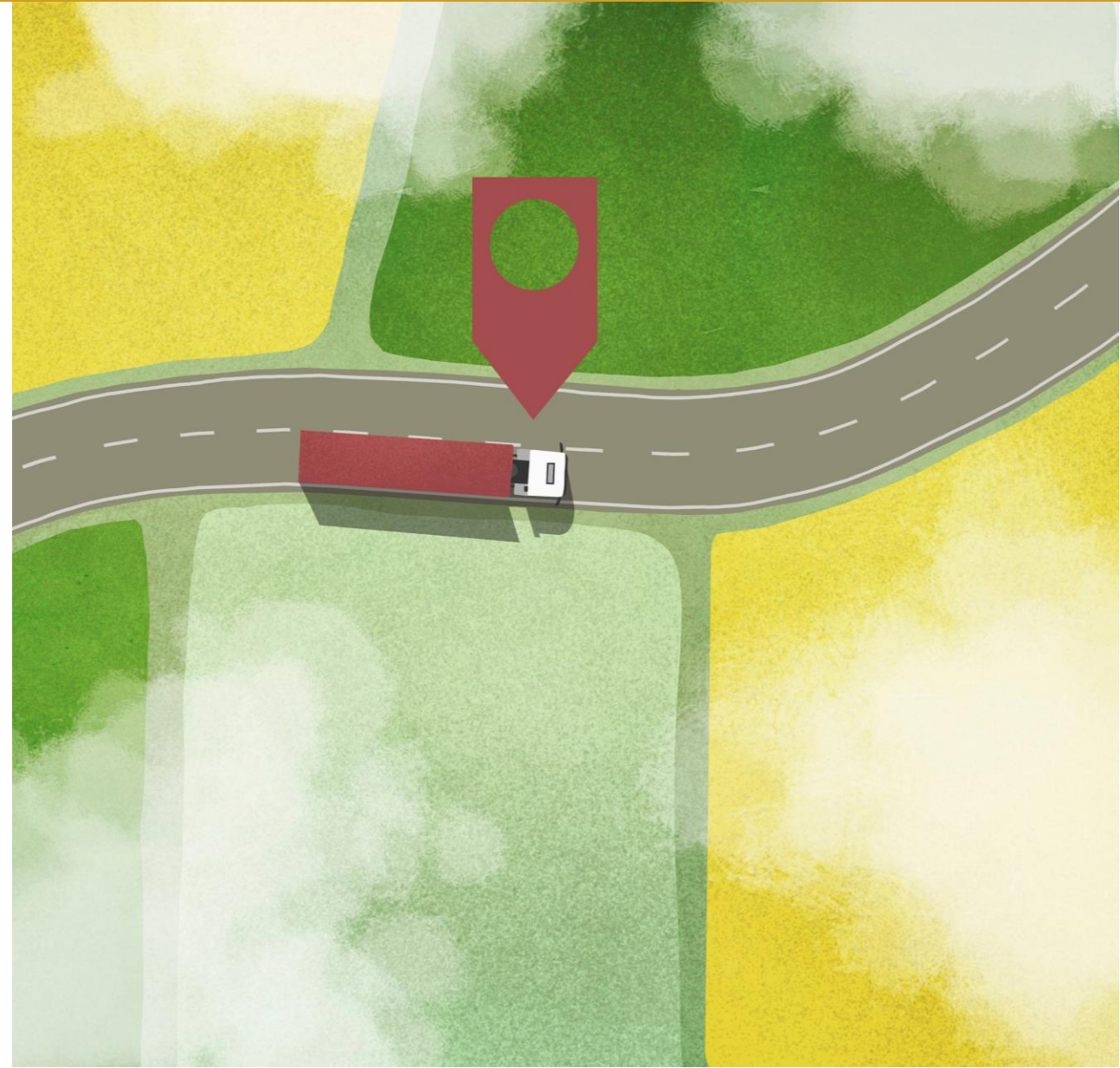
- Expanding efforts to enforce illegal truck parking

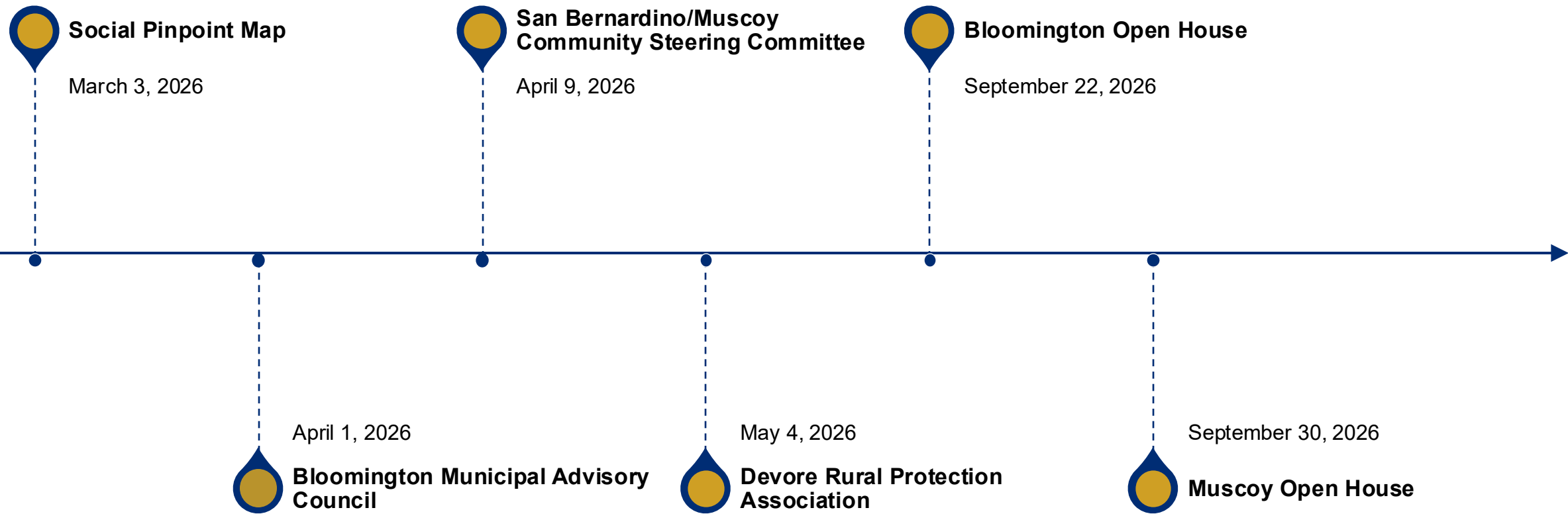
Commercial Vehicles at Residences

- Desert and Valley regions allow commercial parking at residences based on parcel size, ownership, and placement

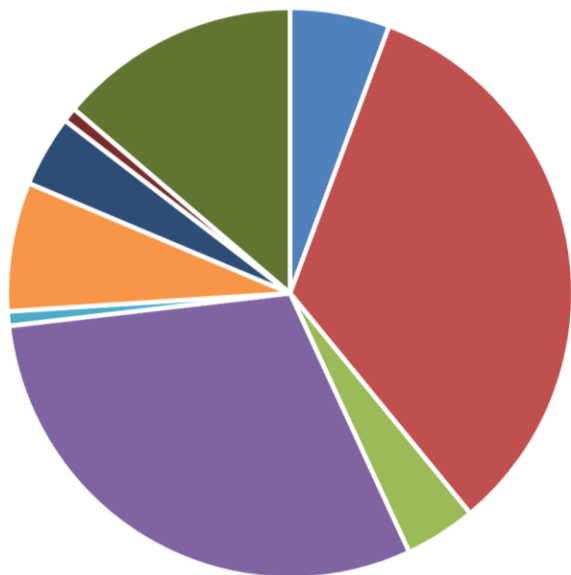


- Truck congestion and safety concerns have been shared with the Department of Public Works- Traffic Division (DPW)
- Reports located in incorporated areas have been shared with the appropriate jurisdiction





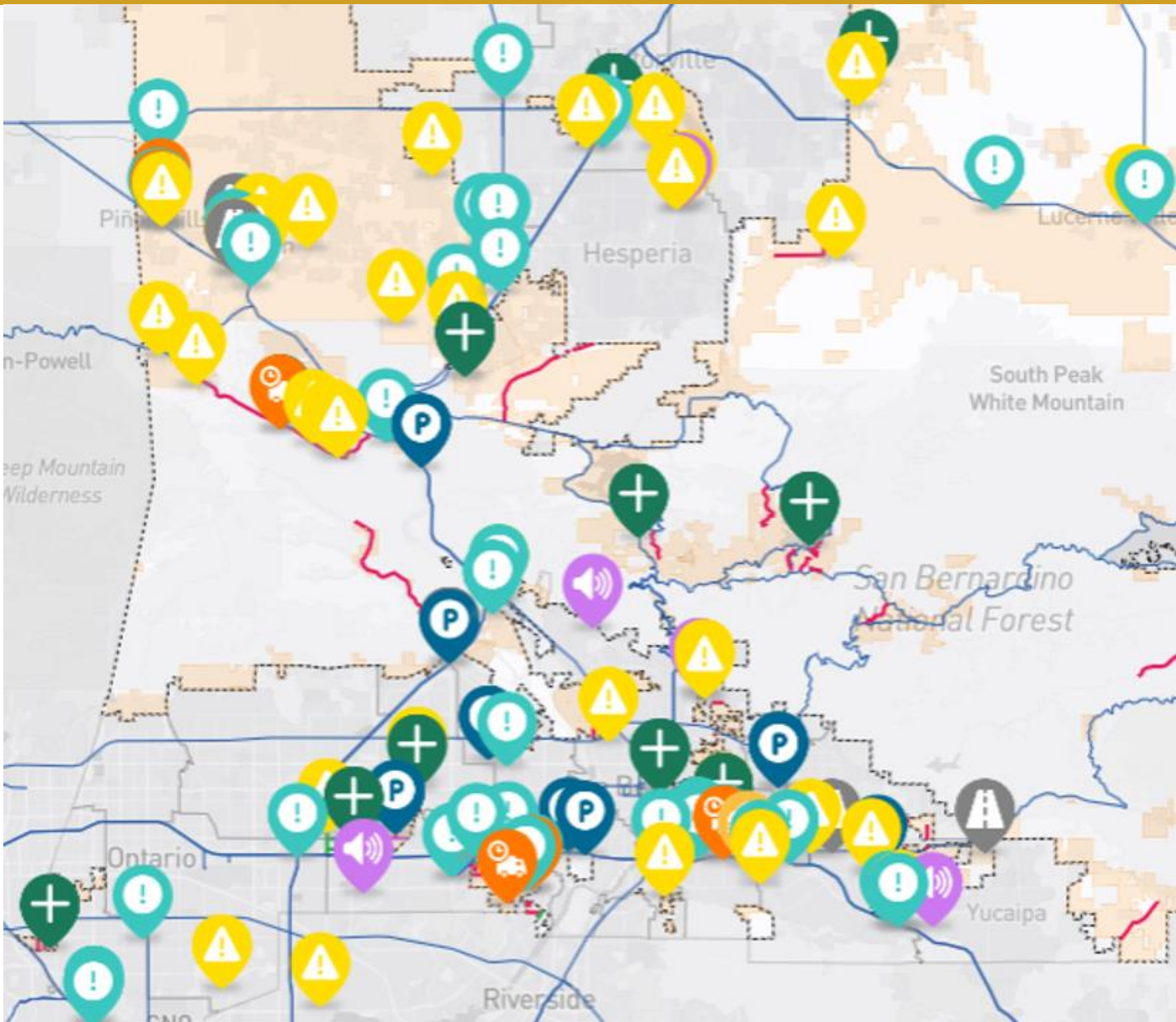
Community Concerns



- Truck Queuing 6%
- Truck Congestion 33%
- Noise Concerns 4%
- Safety Concerns 30%
- Emissions 1%
- Truck Parking 7%
- Infrastructure 4%
- Truck Idling 1%
- Other Comments 14%
